The academic programmes available in UTM IBS are Master of Business Administration (MBA) and PhD in the field of business management. The MBA programmes include general MBA and MBA programmes with specialisations in techno-entrepreneurship, strategic management, and healthcare management. An executive MBA is also offered to professionals with 10 years of working experience.

UTM IBS also organises several short courses, where some of the courses are led by Harvard Business School (HBS) professors.
